Geared to advanced beginner and intermediate knitters, **Knitting on the Coast** retreats offer a relaxed, supportive setting for you to stitch.

The theme of the 2025 Knitting on the Coast Retreat is something we could all use...a little rejuvenation.

Our inspiration comes from the uroboros, an ancient Greek and Egyptian symbol of a serpent eating its tail, often interpreted as a symbol for eternal cyclic renewal and rejuvenation. Also, in early 2025 we will transition from the Chinese zodiac Year of the Dragon to that of the Snake. People born under the sign of the snake are considered deep thinkers possessing a sharp wit and a keen eye for detail—which sounds like a lot of knitters we know.
