For most offices, these activities will take place on weekdays between Friday, November 4, and Friday, November 11.

If you are interested in our virtual volunteer activities (or another opportunity that you've found separate from our inoffice opportunities), you may take your Community Action Day between Friday, November 4, and Friday, November 18.

Inizio Community Action Day The How-To Nitty Gritty

Starting on page 5, we list some in-office and on-site volunteering opportunities that we've discovered near our US offices. And we've found several <u>great virtual activities</u> that you can do no matter where you are. **But you aren't limited to** *our* **suggestions...**

Here are just a few broad categories that might spark some ideas:

- Environmental activities: Tree planting, removing invasive plants, bird counts
- Social activities: Local group engagement, care-inthe-community initiatives
- Educational activities:
 Presentations at local schools, chaperoning a school field trip, local museum/gallery volunteering, etc
- Charitable activities: Donating blood, work at a food bank or other local nonprofit, knitting hats for orphans

Please note the following activities are ineligible:

- Attending or participating in demonstrations, rallies, or political events
- Any activity for an organization that discriminates based on creed, race, color, national origin, religion, age, disability, sex, gender, identity, sexual orientation, pregnancy, or any other legally protected classification
- Political causes, religious activities, or terrorist groups or activities
- Your regular familyfocused volunteer activities, such as coaching a team, PTA, etc

ONCE YOU'VE CHOSEN AN ACTIVITY (cont):

Set up your out-of-office notification

Once that has been cleared, set up your out-of-office notification. When setting your automatic email response, please mention that you are participating in Inizio's Community Action Day. Feel free to use the below as a template:

"Hello and thank you for your email—I am currently offline today taking part in Inizio's first-ever Community Action Day, where I'll be joining my colleagues to give back to our local community. See what we're up to by searching #InizioCommunityAction Day on social media."

Bill your time!

Please bill the time you spend volunteering for your Inizio Community Action Day activity—in any increment up to 7.5 hours—to **job number ID100130**.

For the **Task Description** under job number ID100130, select the category that *best matches* your charity activity from the drop-down list.

In-Office Volunteering

On *Monday, Nov 14 and Tuesday, Nov 15,* we'll collect food in the SF office for the <u>SF-Marin Food</u>

<u>Bank</u>. Please view their most-needed food list online (or below), and then look through your pantry or stop by the grocery store—or have groceries delivered to work!—to pick up some necessities for your neighbors with less.

We'll drop off what we collect at SF-Marin Food Bank partner The Richmond
Neighborhood Center. Around 20,000 Richmond district residents, mostly seniors, families with children, those unemployed, and low-wage workers, struggle with hunger.

Important staples include peanut butter, low-sodium soups, chili, stews, canned fruit, canned vegetables, canned tuna, chicken, or salmon, canned beans, whole grain pasta, brown rice, and low-sugar cereals. No open packages or glass jars.

On-Site Volunteering

Consider volunteering to serve meals with **GLIDE**, which has this mission of creating a radically inclusive, just, and loving community mobilized to alleviate suffering and break the cycles of poverty and marginalization.

Just a few of the many upcoming volunteer choices include working at a food pantry, helping out at the Sickle Cell Foundation of Georgia, helping with homework for Girls Inc of Greater Atlanta, gardening at the Oakhurst Community Garden, delivering groceries to seniors with the Covington First United Methodist Church Food Pantry, or being a "warehouse warrior" at Helping Mamas, Inc.

Refugees start their lives over in the US with next to nothing and face the difficult challenge of learning a new culture and language.



Does my volunteer activity have to be during the work week, during normal work hours?

Community Action Day is a benefit for you, and for your community. We set up Community Action Day to make it easy for you to fit it into your schedule without having to work extra hours.

With your manager's approval, you can take up to a full day (or two half days) over the course of the Community Action Day period (Friday, November 4 through Friday, November 18).

If the volunteer opportunity you want to participate in for Community Action Day is available *only* outside of normal working hours or on a weekend, you may coordinate with your line manager to take the amount of time off during the week that you spend at your community volunteer activity (up to 7.5 hours).

If you are an hourly employee and interested in a volunteer activity outside of normal working hours, we ask that you speak with your line manager and your HR business partner.

Frequently Asked Questions

I used my 2022 Employer-Sponsored Volunteering benefit. Am I still eligible to take time off for a Community Action Day volunteer activity?

Yes, these are separate opportunities for you to support your local communities!

What if my activity doesn't take an entire day?

We ask that you bill *only* the time that it takes you to conduct your activity to the Community Action Day job number (ID100130).

Please note that the intent of this opportunity is to make a positive impact on our local communities. If you are not interested in volunteering, please work your regular schedule.

May I donate blood for my US Community Action Day activity?

Yes! This sounds like a *great* way to give back to your local community.

May interns participate?

Yes, interns *may* participate! We ask that you first speak with your line manager and your HR business partner to express your interest.



May I work for a political campaign as my US Community Action Day activity?

Unfortunately, no. Political activities are on the <u>short list</u> <u>of activities ineligible</u> for the US Community Action Day.

However, there are nonpartisan activities that you can do to give back to your community on or before your election day, such as helping seniors and others get to the polls or signing up to be a poll worker (not a poll watcher, but a poll worker). Contact your local elections board for more information.
